

**Limestone Township Supervisors Meeting
November 12, 2024**

Meeting opened at 6:30 this evening.

The Secretary/Treasurer Report:

Brian made a motion to approve the August minutes which was seconded by Stanley. All in favor, motion carries.

Secretary/Treasurer Report

Timesheets and bills: signed by Supervisors. Foreign Fire Relief Fund checks were signed so that they could be sent to New Berlin Fire Company and Mifflinburg Fire Department. This is State aide that is equally distributed to the fire companies that serve the Township.

Emergency Management:

Planning Commission Report:

The Board is currently reviewing a plan for a Storage facility outside of New Berlin.

New Business:

Code Enforcement:

There were 7 permits issued. Linus Martin for a barn, Ben Hayes for a storage shed, Paul Hetrick for an implement shed, Ammon Zimmerman for an implement shed, James Hoover for a calf pen, Kale Gisewite for a garage and James O'Brien for a driveway.

Public Comment:

Jen Colna came to ask the supervisors questions about the New Berlin Storage Facility project. She wants the Supervisors to protect the interests of the residents by addressing her concerns. Is this commercial property going to look bad for the community and decrease property values? Will there be an excessive amount of light or noise from these buildings? Would they be accessible 24/7 or fenced in and locked to prevent vagrancy or from becoming a "hang out" that might present other problems?

Mr. O'Brien was not present to answer these questions and in light of the fact that the Supervisors are not familiar with the SALDO they could not answer any of these questions. There are no Ordinances that deal with those specific questions so Teresa is going to contact Mr. O'Brien and have him attend the next Planning Commission meeting to address those questions.

Unfinished Business:

Attorney Neidig reminded the Supervisors that the Agricultural Securities for Paul Hetrick Jr. will mature in January.
