

**Limestone Township Supervisors Meeting
February 4, 2025**

Attendance: Teresa Haines, Donovan Imgrund, Stanley Bingaman, Brian Haines, Jamen Hetrick, Carl Reeder, Ron Quinn, and Rich Himmelreich.

Meeting opened at 6:30 this evening.

The Secretary/Treasurer Report:

Rich made a motion to approve the February minutes which was seconded by Brian. All in favor, motion carries. Resolution 2025-1 which was approved in January was signed and sealed at this meeting.

A resident of the township, who asked not to be named, reported that the neighbor was in violation of the Nuisance Ordinance as the property is starting to look like a junkyard. It was requested that a member of the Township come out and take pictures to verify the complaint. It was suggested that we put an item on the March agenda for discussion as to whether or not this should be a regular duty or a new position should be created for Ordinance enforcement. Jamen Hetrick was hired this week as part of the Roadcrew.

The Supervisors discussed combining with other Townships for Tar and Chip Bids, getting the Paving Bids ready through Brian Haight and preparing the Stone Bids. Rich made a motion to move forward with advertising all bids when they were ready which was seconded by Brian. All in favor, motion carries.

Planning Commission Report:

Conditional approval was given to the Homestead Heights Project and the Stormwater Plan for Reiff's Barn.

Emergency Management Report:

January's list was presented for the 911 call responses in the Township. There were 10. Code Enforcement:

A permit was issued for a chicken house addition and solar panels for a house on Vista Heights Drive.

Public Comment:

Ron Quinn reported that he now has all of the Water Authority residents on a mass text/email alert system going forward when issues arise. There was a resent boil advisory due to a power outage but there was no actual damage to any water lines.

Carl Reeder asked the Supervisors to consider a creating a Sewage Treatment Facility due to all of the cabins along Penns Creeks becoming permanent home and/or vacation rentals. Teresa was going to contact Laron in the near future about other possible option that would be less costly than installing public sewer lines and a treatment plant. He also asked that the Supervisors consider publicly speaking out against the County's legal system involving a local case. The Township attorney advised Mr. Reeder that the Supervisors could not involve themselves in making statements involving private individuals that have no direct impact on the Township or its residents.

Unfinished Business:

Due to a clerical error Paul Hetrick was missing from the February agenda and will need to be put back on for March for Ag. Securities.
