Meeting opened at 6:30 this evening.

The Secretary/Treasurer Report:

Chris Darrup inquired as to whether or not the Supervisors have decided on granting an exception to his proposed project or if they would consider changing the Ordinance to allow for a high percentage of land usage. Exceptions are generally discouraged and the Supervisors are not really interested in changing the Ordinance. They would like input from the Township Solicitor who is not present. Teresa will reach out to her to see if she is able before the next meeting to offer a legal opinion before any decisions are made.

A special meeting was held to discuss phone bids to install shutoff valves in the lines that service the Township Residents from Mifflinburg Borough.

In attendance were the Supervisors, Brian Haines, Rich Himmelreich, and Stanley Bingaman, as well as Teresa Haines, Phil Walter, and Andrew Keister.

Shutoff valves need to be installed to help narrow down the undetectable water leak. This will not completely solve the problem but help narrow down the location. These valves should have been incorporated into the original design and more will need to be installed.

Gutelius had not provided a bid at the time of the meeting. Schlegel Excavating provided an estimate of approximately \$8600.00. Rich made a motion to accept the estimate provided the Gutelius had not provided a lower estimate which was seconded by Brian. All in favor, motion carries.

Once the parts are in, Schlegel will call with the earliest possible time that the job can be started. Teresa will prepare a notice to the affected resident letting them know when the water will be shutoff and that there will be 48 hours boil advisory. Skylar will distribute the letters to every home.
