

**Limestone Township Supervisors Meeting
April 7, 2026**

The Secretary/Treasurer Report:

Rich and Stanley stated that they don't want to make any changes to the Solar Ordinance at this time. Stanley made a motion to keep the Solar Ordinance as it is currently written which was seconded by Rich. No exception will be granted for Chris Darrup for his proposed solar project.
